

## Bridegroom Gets High Before His Wedding

Darius Lewellyn got high before his wedding Saturday afternoon.

So did all the male members of the wedding party, as his bride, 21-year-old Patricia Profit, the minister and members of the families looked on.

The bridegroom took the final plunge just after noon, parachuting from 1,200 feet in a North Carolina Air National Guard C-130 transport plane to a drop zone near Back Creek Presbyterian Church at Mount Ulla.

The men are members of Company C, Third Battalion, 11th Special Forces Unit, a Green Beret Army Reserve Unit headquartered in Winston-Salem.

They decided the 30-year-old first lieutenant's wedding would be a good time to make one of the parachute jumps they are required to complete once every three months, and thought the jump would attract publicity for the unit, which has some vacancies to fill.

First out of the plane was Lewellyn, who was followed by all best men, SFC Steve Faust, all told, 12 reservists parachuted to the site, on the Harry Hall farm about 10 miles west of Salisbury.

Lewellyn's role in the day's activities was clearly marked. On his arm, he wore a blue garter, a gift of the best man. His bride waited for him on the ground.

"Hey," she said.

"Hey," replied the lieutenant.

"I didn't think I was supposed to see you before the wedding," a festive mood prevailed on the ground during the drop operation. Some of the Green Beret's ex-Reserve buddies were sipping bloody Marys, and the bridegroom's family said the jump idea was fine.

But one of the chutists, walking toward the crowd, was overheard to tell Miss Profit: "Pat, I wouldn't do this for anybody but you."

The bride regretted not being able to make the jump with her fiancé. "I've begged and begged, but apparently that's not something a woman's chaplain is allowed to do."

Marrow, pastor of Back Creek Presbyterian Church and officiating minister at the 2:30 p.m. ceremony, said the unit was trying to recruit women. Miss Profit said she hoped the rest of the wedding would be more traditional (it was a military ceremony), but that she had wanted "something unusual."

The unit dispensed with route in follow-up activities to walk to the church and change into dress greens for the wedding. The couple will live in Myrtle Beach, S.C., where Lieutenant Lewellyn has moved his construction business. The bride is a real estate salesperson.

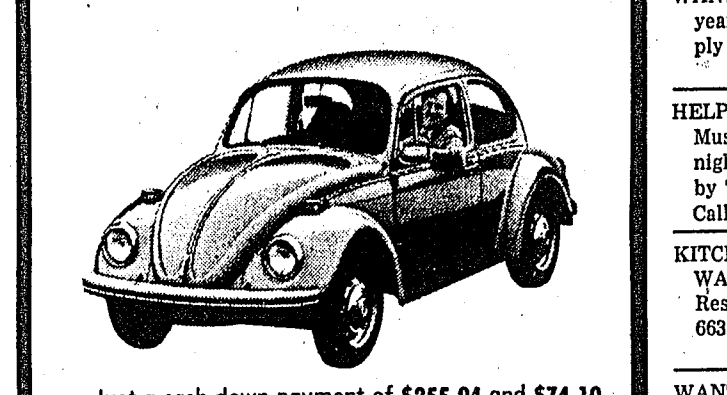

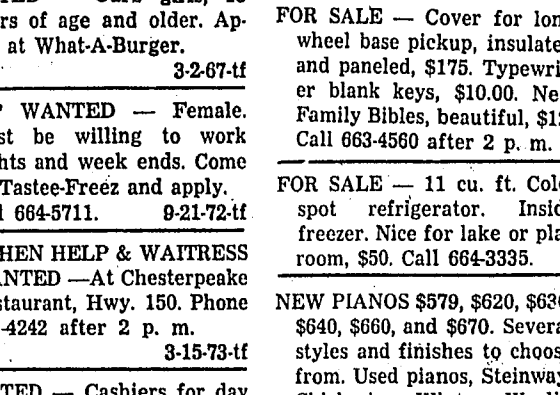
