Cable paced Rockwell, with two hits apiece.

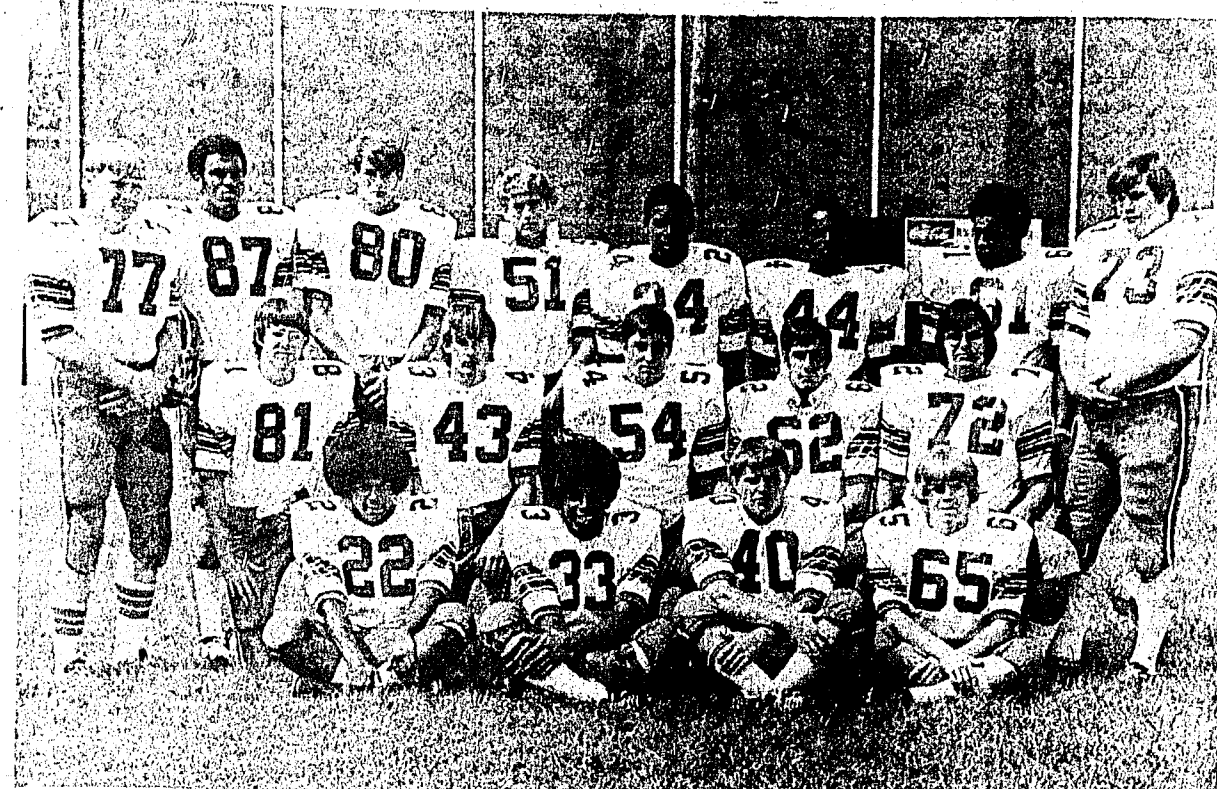
Ellis, behind the pitching of Jim Sides and the hitting of Dick Peeler, breezed by Faith, 18-2.

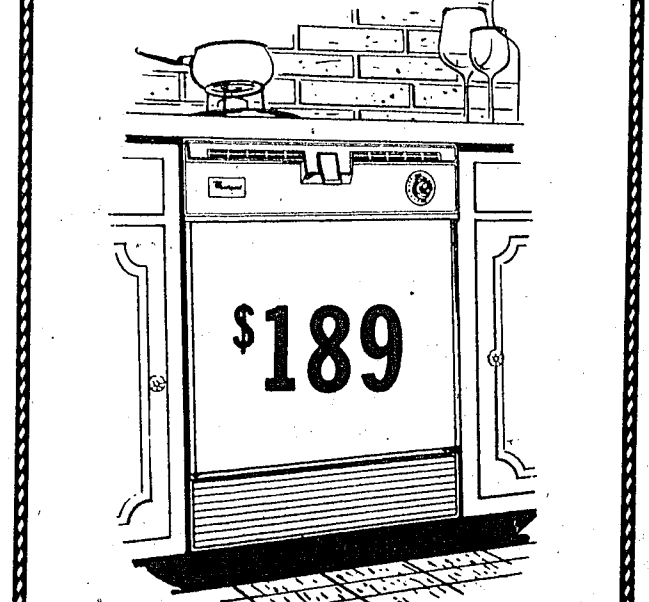
