Inevitable Product Of Life's Processes

From 7 a. m. until 4 p. m. every workday, Frank Lipe is busy doing what he's doing—burying solid waste at the Mooresville sanitary landfill off U. S. 21 near the water treatment plant. The town's homes, businesses, industries and services produce a never-slacking flood of debris, and disposing of it keeps the municipal sanitation department's men and equipment at work. The town's five-acre landfill will serve as a disposal site another three

years if it is used only by the town. But the county government is negotiating with the town for access to a landfill in South Iredell—and this is the only one around. The local and county governments are working to locate more landfill land. Once a new site is assured, rural county residents will have access to the landfill, and the county will assume operation of the new facility.

Distinguished Military Student

Charles K. Torrence, son of Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Torrence of Mooresville, route 4, has been named a distinguished military student in the Reserve Officers' Training Corps at Appalachian State University in Boone. To qualify as a distinguished military student, a cadet must rank in the top 10 per cent of his ROTC class, in his military science III subjects or in the top one-third of his military science III class and the top one-half of his college class.

Davidson Gets \$25,000 Grant For Planning Vocational Programs

Davidson College has received a \$25,000 grant from the U.S. Office of Education to

coordinate existing programs and plan new ones in the area of vocational preparation.

"It is becoming increasingly difficult for students to gain acceptance into graduate school, and increasingly difficult for people with Ph. D. to find jobs," said Prof. Randall Kincaid, director of Davidson's Career-Service program.

"We need to explore new ways to give our students vocational experiences before they graduate from college, and to help students who are not interested in graduate school become better aware of what they can do after graduating," he added.

Currently Davidson has separate programs for placement (helping seniors and recent graduates find jobs), vocational counseling, and Career-Service, which is a new means of encouraging interested students to spend part of a year away from campus exploring a career possibility or working in a service project.

"We hope to coordinate these various programs, and perhaps to employ one person to oversee all of them, using some of this federal grant money," Kincaid said.

In the area of pre-professional training, faculty advisory committees on the nursing, law, medicine, and business-management have been encouraged to help students who are not accepted by graduate and medical schools, as well as those who are not accepted, Kincaid added.
