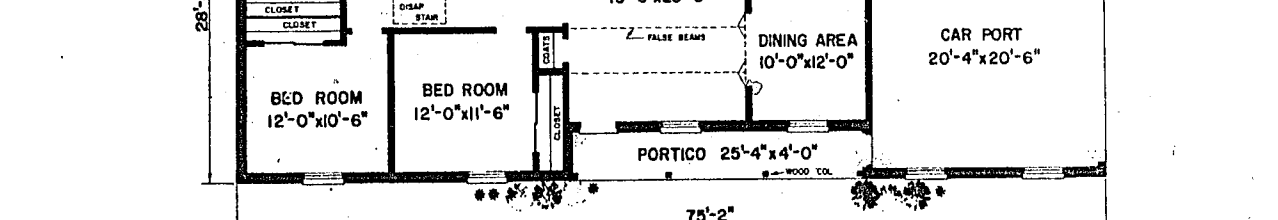
Attractive Ranch House Features Large Central Activity Room

Pregnant women should consult a doctor before receiving any kind of immunization or taking any drugs. Some drugs can affect the baby. So can more than moderate amounts of alcohol.

The expectant mother should follow the diet her doctor gives her. He will probably tell her to drink plenty of milk and eat fruits and vegetables, and foods such as fish which are rich in iodine. She should avoid excesses of dried, starchy or oily food, candy, cakes, spices and nuts.

The mother-to-be may hear some strange and frightening tales about pregnancy and childbirth. But her doctor knows what's best for her and the baby. Following his advice she can reduce the risk of danger to her baby and discomfort to herself.
