More than two-thirds of women veterans believed to be eligible for education and training under the GI Bill have not used these benefits, and time is running out for those discharged before June 1, 1968.

The spring semester enrolled 15,600 women veterans under the GI Bill. Most of those who have trained have been in college.

Air Force leads the services with 13,157 women veterans who have enrolled under the GI Bill. The Army has 11,814; Navy, 10,895; Marine Corps, 3,863; Coast Guard, 17; and Public Health Service, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and others, 4,443.
