## Vance Shepherd To Address Stroke Club

Vance Shepherd, president of the Charlotte Stroke Club, will be the guest speaker at the Thursday, August 27 meeting of the newly organized Mooreville Stroke Club. The meeting will be held at 7 p.m. in the Library of the Lake Norman Regional Medical Center.

On April 25, 1972, at 9:00 a.m., Vance Shepherd's life did an about face so dramatic that he remembers the exact time and what he was doing—smoking a cigarette.

He was alone at his Charlotte home when everything on his left side went to sleep. At age 39, he had suffered a stroke that left him unable to walk.

"My whole world collapsed," he says, "like a house of cards."

Almost 15 years later, he has remembered that house of cards; although the design is somewhat different. "Everybody feels life is over," he says. "It's not over; it's changed."

Shepherd is associated with the North Carolina Easter Seals Society and he travels across North Carolina talking about strokes and this is what he will be doing in Mooreville next Thursday.

His thoughts for the evening will be based on his and his family's experiences since 1972. At the close of the talk, he will moderate an exchange of ideas or tips with those present that has proved useful to all involved.
