A game show format entitled "Getting Ready Pay Equity" presented through a question and answer format related facts such as 56 million women head households in the U.S. today. American women make an average of 69 cents to each dollar earned by American men, that most women work through necessity and not choice, and that the poverty level of families maintained by women exceeds 30 percent. The facts on pay equity are certainly alarming for many women and their daughters, the working women of the future. The BPW members learned they can combat these inequities through utilization of the legislative process, education of the media and the public, and being an opportunist.

The informative program presented in a fun format was followed by committee reports and action on old and new business.
