

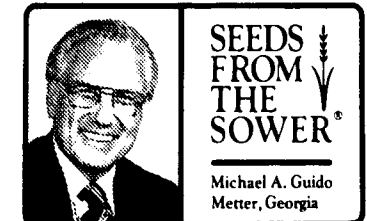
Iredell Residents Honored

Two Statesville residents were among those volunteers honored at the American Heart Association, North Carolina Affiliate's 42nd Annual Meeting, Delegate Assembly and Scientific Sessions on May 17 at the Sheraton Imperial Hotel in the Research Triangle Park.

A 20-Year Service Award was presented to Dr. Ralph Bentley, for rendering at least 20 years of outstanding and progressive leadership at the community, state or national level of the American Heart Association. The award is an engraved shadow box.

Dr. Paul M. Kirshman received the 10-Year Service Award, given to volunteers who have rendered 10 or more years of continuous and outstanding service in two or more of the Affiliate's major areas of interest. Those interests include fund raising, community programs, publicity and administration. The award is a bronze medallion bearing the recipient's name.
