tempted murder of a Troutman

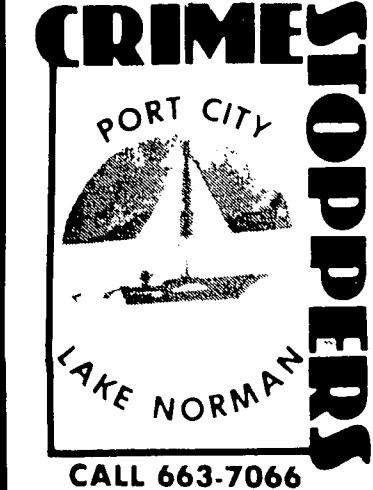
family.
At approximately 6:30 a.m. on
May 21, John Black, his wife, and
daughter were leaving their
residence on Amity Hill Road for
the baby-sitters and on to work,
when Black stopped their car to
remove a log which was blocking
their driveway.
When he left the vehicle a
black male approached them,
armed with a revolver, and
demanded money. He then forced
the couple to drive to a secluded
area on Bethesda Road and
forced John Black into a pond.

The suspect then threw the
daughter Jessica, into the pond
but her father was able to save
her. The suspect then forced the
victims to drive to B&B Paint and
Body Shop where he tried to ob-
tain money by having Mrs. Black
go into the business and get
Black's brother to write out a
check. Authorities were called,
and when they arrived on the
scene the suspect ran into the
woods.

The suspect is a black male, age
30's, five-foot seven-inches, 145
lbs, slim build, brown eyes and
black hair, dark complexion.
Suspect had scars on his forehead
and was last seen wearing blue
jeans, a tan coat and camouflage
hat.

4H Sailing Camp Set

Young people interested in
sailing can attend 4-H Sailing
Camp June 30 to July 6 at Mitchell
4-H Camp near Swansboro.

The camp is not limited to 4-H
members. It is open to anyone
between 12 and 18 years old, said
Nelson McCaskill, Iredell Extension
4-H agent.

"This is an exciting camp, much
different from traditional ones,"
McCaskill said.

Trained instructors will teach
and supervise both beginning and
experienced sailors. Beginners
will learn how to sail using Sun-
fish sailboats. More experienced
campers will use catamarans to
improve their skills.

Campers also will be able to
participate in a variety of other
activities, including swimming,
canoeing, archery and marine

science explorations. They'll also
take a trip to nearby Hammocks
Beach State Park.

The cost of the camp is \$130. It
covers meals, lodging, program-
ming and limited insurance. By
June 1, the fee is \$150. Attend-
ance is limited to 50 campers.

Adults with sailing experience
who would like to work with the
campers may apply to attend the
camp free of charge.

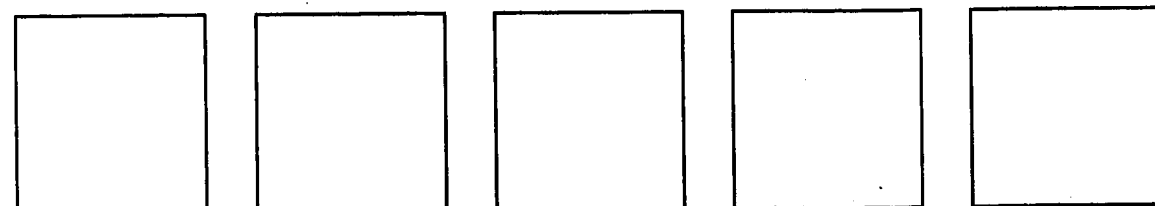

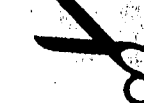
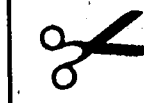
