Plans are continuing for the Historical Evening which will be celebrated on April 26 at the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church. At this time, Crosses of Military Service will be bestowed to Veterans of United States Wars, who have Confederate lineage. Officers of the general organization and the North Carolina Division will be present and take part in the Bestowal ceremony. This occasion also marks the 50th anniversary of the Confederate Monument at the entrance to the Willow Valley Cemetery. This Monument was placed by the Chapter and dedicated May 9, 1941.

The meeting was closed with an historical message on General Joseph O. Shelby, who was compared to General Jeb Stuart. He was known as the best Cavalry general in the South. During the final days of the War Between the States, when the Confederate cause was waning, he proclaimed there would be no surrender, and he exhorted his men to stand

together, to keep their arms, in hatred of oppression, and to prefer death to dishonor. However, when the war was over, General Shelby accepted the terms of the treaty and was a staunch loyalist to the United States. Someone wrote concerning this fiery and capable leader: "Jo Shelby would as gladly have laid down his life for the Stars and Stripes as during the four years of war he would have laid it down for the Stars and Bars."


