

## From Small Beginning Event Turns Into A Golfing Party

It all began as a conversation among friends.  
It has developed into a full-fledged weekend party.  
In between, and with plans still being finalized, the first annual Mooresville Players Event Golf Outing has materialized.  
It is set to take place April 27-28 at the Mooresville Municipal Golf Course.  
The outing — planners have steered clear of using the word tournament — has emerged through the contributions of a six-member committee.  
Members of the committee are

the same ones who initially planted the idea when gathering for regular weekend play.  
"We often talked about the idea of having something like this," offered John Gardner, self-appointed ringleader of the group, "but it never went any farther than that. We decided to take it farther. We hope it's something that will be fun as well as competitive. That's what golf is all about."  
The event will cap a golf-filled month of April that also features a capacity field for the annual Mooresville Jaycees Invitational and a one-day Mooresville Business and Professional Women's Club tournament.

Both the Players Event and the BWB affair will be held on the Mooresville course. The Jaycees will stage their yearly attraction at Mallard Head Country Club. Plans continue to fall into place for the inaugural Players Event.  
It will take the form of a two-player team format, although two different playing procedures will be followed.  
Saturday's opening round will be played under a best-ball format, while on Sunday, teams will tackle the layout under a captain's choice format.  
Players may enter as members of a team or as individuals to be placed on a team.  
The only requirement for teams already established is that the players have a combined handicap of more than five.  
Current members of the Mooresville course will be charged an entry fee of \$42 each. Non-members will pay an additional \$20, or \$62, to play.  
In excess of \$600 worth of merchandise is available in each night. Event organizers are plan-

ning to award the first, second and third-place teams in each flight.  
Depending on the amount of entries, anywhere from four to six flights are being projected.  
Teams will be flighted based on their adjusted score from Saturday's opening round.  
The adjustment will be in the form of replacing a team's worst three holes with a par, for flighting purposes.  
Sunday's score will stand unadjusted.  
A team's finish will depend on the total score from both days' play.  
Sponsorships are also available.  
Sponsors may purchase a \$100, or \$50 sponsorship, or provide prizes to be used as gifts during a post-tournament drawing.  
In addition to the two rounds of play, a catered meal will also be provided.

The deadline to enter is April 15. After that, any reserved spots not taken by sponsors will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis.  
The final deadline for all entries is April 19.  
Entry forms are available at the Mooresville course or from any member of the golf committee.  
In addition to Gardner, other committee members include Doris Gardner, Wayne Robinson, Jim Brown, Wayne Archer and J.R. Richle.

"We're really looking forward to a big time for all," added Gardner late last week. "We're really pushing for participation from Mooresville members, but anyone is welcome to play. We'd like to think of this as one big party. We're out here to have some fun, and play some golf."

## Netmen Undeclared In FAC

South Iredell's tennis team entered this week undefeated in the Foothills Athletic Conference after three matches.  
The Vikings added a 5-4 victory over West Iredell last week to earlier-season wins over league foes Wilkes Central and West Iredell again to account for the 3-0 FAC ledger they carried into this week's play.  
Last week's one-point win, secured by virtue of three wins in singles and two victories by doubles teams, marked the second one this season by South Iredell over West Iredell, and provided the Vikes with a sweep of that season series.  
South, standing at 4-3 overall entering this week, managed to split the three singles matches to forge a 3-3 tie entering doubles play.

There, the hosts' numbers two and three twosomes posted pro-set wins to account for the winning points.  
In singles play, South's number three player, Chip Graham, number four Trey Cutrell, and number six Peter Nantz all secured straight set wins.  
In doubles, competition was keener.  
After the Vikes suffered a loss in the battle of number one

doubles teams, the duos of Graham and Tim Barba, and Nantz and Aaron Morrison collected wins.  
Of those two, Graham and Barba were forced into extra games before posting a 10-8, pro-set win.  
The Vikings, currently atop the FAC standings, entered this week with two league matches on tap.  
The Vikes were scheduled to stay at home to host Wilkes Central earlier in the week before making their third road trip of the season by visiting North Iredell.
