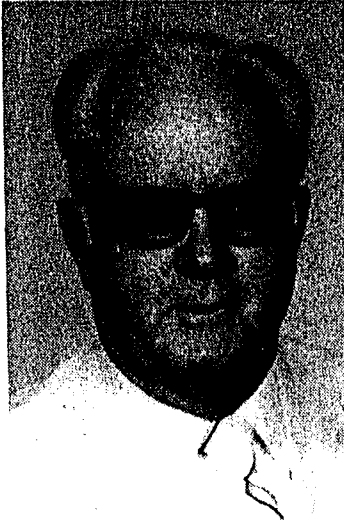

This maximum of \$2,250 must be split between two separate IRAs so no more than \$2,000 is contributed to either IRA.
