

Mooreville Girl Participates In Space Academy II Adventure

Rhonda Chislighi of Mooresville recently trained for a space adventure, explored the future of scientific exploration, earned college credit at U.S. Space Academy Level II, aerospace track, in Huntsville, Ala.

Space Academy trainees in grades 10, 11 and 12 saple astronaut training by using Space Academy's special astronaut training simulators. They spin and twist in the Multi-Axis Train-

ing Simulator, an adaptation of early Mercury program training equipment.

Trainees also bounce high in the air while experiencing the microgravity Training Chair, which is similar to equipment Apollo astronauts used in training for missions to the Moon. They also spin and turn in the Five Degrees of Freedom Trainer, which was used by Gemini astronauts preparing for early

spacewalks. Space Academy Level II trainees use the nation's only full-scale Space Shuttle exhibit to get a better understanding of how the shuttle works. Then they use Space Academy's realistic mission control and Space Shuttle orbiter mockups for training, which leads to a 24-hour simulated space mission. At the conclusion of their training, trainees receive one hour of college freshman-level science credit through the University of Alabama in Huntsville.

Trainees choose one of three fields of study. In the aerospace track, the training includes basic information used by shuttle pilots and commanders.

Because all shuttle pilots and commanders are experienced jet aircraft pilots, the training includes an introduction to aviation. Trainees learn how to prepare and file a flight plan, and they use Space Academy's aircraft simulator to learn basic piloting skills. Other options include technology or engineering training.

Trainees spend several hours learning specific shuttle operations and procedures in preparation for their mission simulations. Pilots and commanders work in Space Academy's "Atlantis" mockup, which was built using NASA blueprints for the motion picture "SpaceCamp." It is considered one of the most authentic cockpit mockups outside of NASA.

Space Academy Level II trainees are housed throughout their eight-day training program in the Space Habitat, a futuristic dormitory built to simulate aspects of the Space Station. They also enjoy the many hands-on activities and demonstrations at the U.S. Space and Rocket Center. And they learn the history of space exploration by touring the Space Center's rocket park, the most comprehensive collection of manned spacecraft rockets on Earth.

Camp A Special 'Challenge'

Camp Challenge is a special summer camp for youth, ages eight to 14, for those who have asthma and/or allergies. An operation of Camp Oak Hill, located near Oxford, North Carolina, this special camp is provided the week of June 9-14, 1991. Camp Challenge is directed by physicians and nurses and is endorsed by the American Lung Association and the American Thoracic Society.

In addition to many fun-filled activities, campers will attend regular sessions dealing with care, self-esteem, and information on asthma and allergies. Each camper receives personal attention and 24-hour medical supervision. Enrollment is limited in order to maintain a ratio of one staff member for every four campers. The American Lung Association has a limited number of scholarships available, but campers must furnish their own transportation.

Alcohol-Drug Information

Tri-County Mental Health Center

The Tri-County Mental Health Center's Detoxification Center at 1419 Boulevard St. in Statesville is open to assist any resident of Davie, Iredell or Rowan County who is intoxicated and wants to sober up from the effects of alcohol or intoxicants.

Persons may be admitted on a voluntary basis and may be taken to the Detox Center by family members. Law enforcement agents, members of Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, or others. Intoxicated persons may refer themselves to the Center.

The facility is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week by individuals trained to work with substance abusers. The Detox Center provides a home environment, has ten beds, and accepts both males and females. Each person using the

Center is expected to follow up with continuing treatment, such as alcohol-drug counseling at Tri-County Mental Health, residential treatment programs and Alcoholics Anonymous.

Before you talk to someone who drinks too much, learn all you can about alcohol and alcoholism. There are many pamphlets and much information about all aspects of alcoholism available at no charge from your Tri-County Mental Health Center.




