Sorority Chapters Celebrate Founder's Day; Install Officers

On April 30 in Mooresville, two chapters of Beta Sigma Phi sorority—Gamma Omega and XI Delta Delta, in concert with 12,500 chapters of 250,000 members throughout the world, celebrated their Founder's Day.

During the Depression, Walter W. Ross thought that young women needed more in their lives than work, responsibility, and hard work. He thought a social and cultural outlet was needed and that he was the man to see that it was provided. His efforts brought seven young women in Abilene, Kansas, together on April 30, 1931 to form that sort of organization. Beta Sigma Phi began, and time proved Walter Ross's idea a good one. Because Beta Sigma Phi has continued to meet their needs, on April 30, Walter Ross was remembered by this largest Greek letter sorority in the world.

Throughout the sixty years of its history, the members of Beta Sigma Phi have enjoyed programs for cultural studies and numerous social events; they had a difference in their lives. As they enjoyed these opportunities for personal growth, they came to devote much of their time and effort to service; they came to make a "real difference" in the world around them.

A typical year finds the chapters donating over \$3 million directly to local charities, reflecting over two million work hours. Early, the chapters created their own international funds for purposes they selected. Their International Endowment Fund has donated over \$2 million to health research groups, to homes for underprivileged children, and to many other worthwhile causes. Through Beta Sigma Phi's International Loan and Scholarship Funds, members and their families receive assistance.

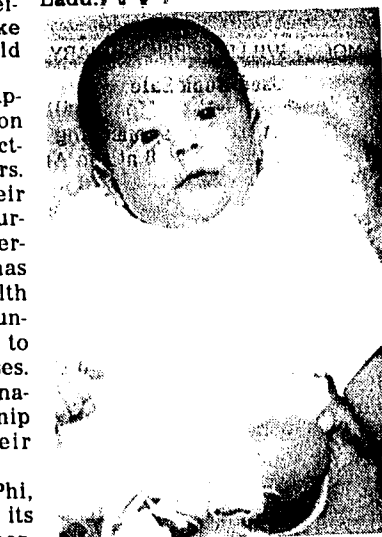

medium-high heat until just hot enough to sizzle a drop of water. Break eggs into pan; immediately scramble with fork. Continue stirring with fork until eggs are thickened throughout, but still slightly moist (the heat retained in the eggs will continue to cook them when they are removed from the pan). Serve with turkey sausage or turkey breakfast strips, toast and a jelly and her favorite juice.

Strawberry Breakfast Soda

1 egg
1 cup milk
1 tablespoon strawberry preserves
1 scoop strawberry ice cream
Combine egg, milk and strawberry preserves; heat or shake until well blended. Pour into a tall glass. Add ice cream. Makes 1 serving. Serve with toasted cinnamon bread or a basket of croissants.

French Toast

1 tablespoon butter or margarine
1 egg
1 tablespoon milk
2 slices bread
Confectioner's sugar (optional)
Syrup or preserves
Melt butter or margarine in a 10-inch skillet or griddle over high heat until just hot enough to sizzle a drop of water. Meanwhile, beat egg and milk with fork in pie pan until well blended. Dip bread slices in egg mixture; turn and coat evenly. Place in skillet. Reduce heat to medium, cook until lightly browned; turn and brown other side. Remove to serving plate and sprinkle lightly with Confectioner's sugar, if desired. Top with syrup or preserves (any flavor).

Egg Sandwich

1 tablespoon butter or margarine
1 egg
Salt and pepper to taste
In a small skillet over medium-high heat, cook butter until just hot enough to sizzle a drop of water (if large skillet is used, more butter will be needed). Carefully break egg and slip egg into pan. Immediately reduce heat. Cook slowly to desired doneness, spoon butter over egg over to allow cooking on both sides. Season with salt and pepper. Serve between slices of buttered toast, toasted raisin, or split and toasted English muffin halves. You can also add a slice of cheese, turkey sausage, turkey bacon slices, turkey ham, or canadian-style bacon.

Merle Norman Staff Attends Convention

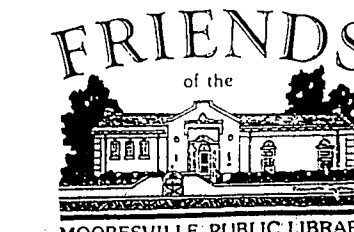

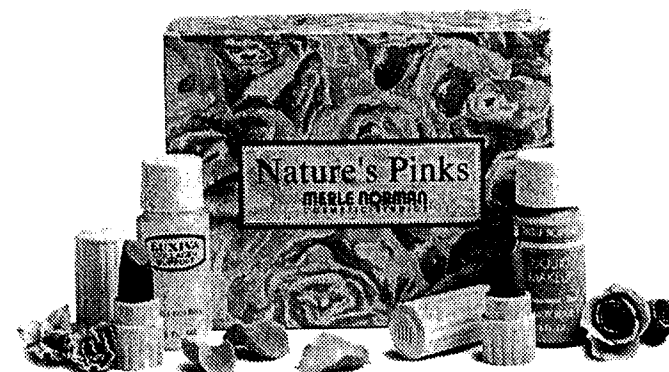
—The Mazeppa 4-H Club will meet Thursday at 7 p.m.

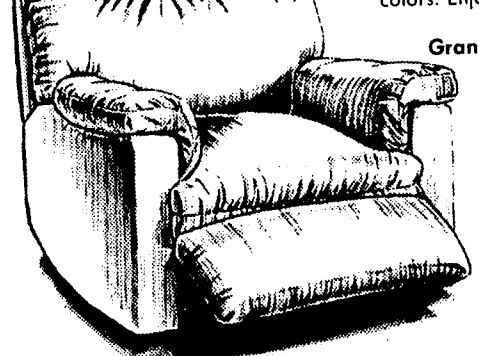
