

Artists Guild Encourages Summer Artfest Interest



Surgery, Prayer For McBrayer

Dena McBrayer of Mooresville is 23 years old and will need a lung transplant and heart repair surgery within the next few months.

Inoperable congenital heart-lung conditions were diagnosed when McBrayer was three. Since then, her family and friends have been praying for a miraculous healing. The answer has come by medical technology catching up to her conditions. Surgery will be scheduled at Michigan Medical Center as soon as details can be worked out.

McBrayer is the daughter of Ron and Wanda McBrayer of Mooresville. She is a 1985 graduate of Mooresville Senior High and will graduate from Mitchell Community College on May 29.

The family is asking the community and friends to place McBrayer high on the prayer list. Any surgery carries a risk and you can sense the seriousness of this procedure. McBrayer and her family believe in the power of prayer and are trusting the Lord for protection. McBrayer considers this as an opportunity to have a normal adult life.

With the heart-lung conditions and other birth defects, McBrayer's medical history has been extensive. Good insurance and a good job have kept the costs manageable, but friends have expressed a desire to help.

In response, a trust fund has been set up to assist with expenses that will not be covered by insurance. If there should be a broad enough base of support, excess funds will be used for financial aid for students at Trevecca Nazarene College.
