



Swimmers' Splashdown On Schedule

Swimmers, to your marks. Get set. Splash!

Splashdown for Mooreville's public swimmers is on schedule, with the Olympic-size facility owned and managed by the Mooreville Recreation Department scheduled to open for the season June 8.

In keeping with an agenda followed in the past, the pool will once again open for public swimming the first weekend following area high school graduation ceremonies.

In preparation for its official

opening less than two weeks away, the pool started filling with water late Tuesday afternoon. Chemicals keeping the water clean are to be added to the pool today (Wednesday).

The pool will begin its summer-long run June 8 and will be open for swimming seven days a week until closing in late August.

The pool will again adhere to the familiar hours of 1:30 p.m. weekdays and weekends.

Admission fees also remain the same, with those swimmers 12 years of age and under admitted for 75 cents and those older swim-

ming for \$1 a day.

In addition to regular swimming hours, the pool will be open at several times throughout the summer for evening family swims.

Ben Phillips will serve as the pool manager this season, overseeing a complete staff of skilled lifeguards.

Lifeguards will be on duty for all public swimming.

Private parties will again be able to use the facility on a reserved basis.

Concern over the pool's facilities have been at the top of recreation department concentration so far this spring.

Due to the age of the facility, combined with tougher guidelines for public facilities to follow, there is a possibility that the pool may have to drain its water on a more frequent basis this swimming season if its recirculation system does not meet with required standards.

Sandy Church, Mooreville's superintendent of recreation, stated early this week that all preliminary tests reveal that all systems are working accordingly, thanks in large part to a state-of-the-art, \$6,000 computer that is used to regulate chemical distribution.

In addition to helping usher in the swimming season with its opening early next month, the pool will also maintain its schedule of offering swimming lessons.

Additional information on the swimming lessons is available through the recreation department.

Moors Feeling Little Pressure Defending Area, District Titles

"Not at all," beamed Meadows between snips of hair while bartering on one of his regular customers late last week.
