'At-risk' fathers are focus of book by UNCC professor

Two university professors have co-written a new book, "Fathering at Risk: Helping Nonresidential Fathers" to provide a better understanding of the problem of absent fathers and offer strategies to help them become more involved in their children's lives.

Nearly one-third of American children, almost 17 million, do not share a home with their biological father. Each year, another one million children are born to unwed parents who will separate soon after their birth, while another million children will feel the pain of divorce.

James R. Dudley, a professor of social work at UNC Charlotte, and Glenn Stone, assistant professor of family studies and social work at Miami of Ohio, wrote the book at a period in American society that Dudley calls the "best and worst of times to be a father."

"Now, perhaps more than ever, fathers are encouraged to take an active role, emotionally and as a provider, in the upbringing of their children," Dudley said. "But at the same time, and in many ways, fathers are seen as the secondary parent, and by design or not, public policy often discourages or deters active fathering."

Dudley and Stone's book discusses the social phenomenon of the disappearing father and looks at three groups of at-risk fathers — teenagers, unmarried fathers, and non-custodial divorced fathers. The book also offers some perspectives concerning social barriers that help

explain the decline of the fathering role for many men. In addition to assessing the needs of fathers, the book examines policies and programs that can assist at-risk fathers.

Dudley and Stone also devote chapters to describing specific programs for teen fathers, unmarried fathers and divorced fathers. Suggestions for mediating disputes when mothers and fathers split up complete the volume.

"But this book is not a one-sided treatise about fathers," Dudley said. "Fathers, as well as mothers, have positive and negative factors that need to be considered."

Nevertheless, Dudley and Stone believe the need is critical to assist fathers specifically and to strengthen the fathering role.

"Children who live apart from their biological father are more likely to be poor, experience adjustment problems, be victims of child abuse, and engage in criminal behavior than children who live with both of their biological parents," Dudley said. "When a father is involved in the rearing of children, the children have another adult who loves them, another adult to be a role model, and another adult to help them be happy and successful in life."

License renewal topic for public hearings

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff will hold public meetings Tuesday, Sept. 25 in Huntersville on the environmental review related to the application of Duke Energy Corporation to renew the operating licenses for both units of the McGuire Nuclear Station.

The public is invited to comment on environmental issues the NRC should consider in reviewing the proposed renewal. The meetings will be held at the auditorium on the North Campus of the Central Piedmont Community College, located at 11920 Verhoeff Road, Huntersville. There will be two similar sessions, at 1:30 p.m. and 7 p.m. In addition, the NRC staff will host informal discussions one hour prior to each meeting. NRC staff members will be available to answer questions and provide additional information about the process during those informal sessions, but no comment submissions on environmental issues will be accepted then.

For planning purposes, those who wish to attend or present oral comments at the meetings may register by contacting James Wilson of the

NRC by telephone at (800) 368-5642, extension 1108, or by email at McGuireEIS@nrc.gov no later than Sept. 20. Interested persons may also register to speak before the start of each session. Individual comment time may be limited by the time available.

Under NRC regulations, the original operating license for a nuclear power plant is issued for up to 40 years. The license may be renewed for up to an additional 20 years if NRC requirements are met. The current operating licenses for McGuire Nuclear Station, Units 1 and 2, will expire on June 12, 2021, and March 3, 2023 respectively. Duke submitted its application for license renewal in June.

As part of its application, Duke submitted an environmental report, which is available for public review in the NRC Public Document Room at One White Flint North, 11555 Rockville Pike, Rockville, Md. In addition, the J. Murrey Atkins Library at UNC-Charlotte has agreed to make the report available for public inspection. The application is also available on the NRC Web page at www.nrc.gov/NRC/.

REACTOR/LR/McGuire/Inde x.html.

A "Generic Environmental Impact Statement for License Renewal of Nuclear Plants," (NUREG-1437), assesses the scope and impact of environmental effects that would be associated with license renewal at any nuclear power plant site. NRC staff is gathering information at the September meeting for a supplement specific to the McGuire Station.

The NRC staff will prepare a draft statement supplement for public comment and will

hold a public meeting. After consideration of comments received on the draft, a final EIS supplement will be prepared.

Written comments may also be submitted on the scope of the McGuire-specific supplement to the generic environmental impact statement, by Oct. 21, either by mail to the Chief, Rules and Directives Branch, Division of Administrative Services, Mail Stop T-6-D-59, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, D.C. 20555-0001 or by Internet to: McGuireEIS@nrc.gov
