Duo exits with third Civic Classic crown

There's just something about the annual Lake Norman Civic Golf Classic that brings out the best in the team of Jay Huntley and Rick Morrow.

Their magic worked again last weekend.

The duo picked the right time and right place to cook up the best round of all teams during the final round Sunday on the home Mooresville Municipal Golf Course, overcoming a two-stroke deficit entering the final 18 holes to claim in with a one-stroke victory and claim their third Classic championship in the last 10 editions.

"I can't explain it, either," shrugged Huntley, hauling away his share of the event's largest chunk of the winnings following play late Sunday afternoon. "We just play well together in this thing. Rick hits it a long way, and, if he keeps it in play, he's a great partner to have. I just try to keep us steady. I guess we work well together."

He'd guess right. The duo headed into Sunday's play from the pushed-back, blue-colored championship tees trailing by two strokes following Saturday's play that found all of the nearly 50 players in the field hitting from the closer - by just over 500 yards - white teeing ground.

They fashioned a round of five-under par 67 Saturday to trail midway leaders Jason Meadows and Bubba Hendren by that margin after the latter teamed to shoot the entire tournament's best single-round score of seven-under 65.

On Sunday, Huntley and Morrow made up the ground with one stroke to spare, combining their own six-under 66 with the three-under 69 fashioned by Meadows and Hendren, the former passing the latter in

the process to claim the single-stroke win. The eventual winners also cashed in by posting the best round of the second-day play within their Championship A flight.

Meadows and Hendren finished alone in second by that stroke's difference.

In the Championship B flight, 36 holes of regulation play wasn't enough to settle matters, forcing them back on the course for a sudden-death playoff.

After teammate and son Chip Pickard safely secured par with a two putt, Rock Pickard delivered a birdie at the par-five first to give that all-in-the-family duo the win.

The Pickards posted a flight tying-best round of two-over par 74 from the blue tees Sunday to make up a one-stroke deficit after

Saturday's play and tie the team of Freddie Rinehardt and Mike Ray, the latter shooting 75 Sunday after a 71 Saturday, thus forcing the decision into a playoff.

Both teams finished 36 holes with 146 strokes that put matters back on the course to decide. The team of Larry Neill and Mark Beaver matched the winning team's 74 to share Sunday's best-round honors.

In the First Flight, where all play was held from the white tees, the team of Tommy Wingate and Larry Ingle made use of all the room the had following their opening round's total to escape with a single-stroke victory.

The duo's 79 Sunday, following a 78 Saturday, gave them a putt's edge over the twosome of Richard

Bradshaw and Ronnie Clodfelter. That came despite the fact that the eventual runners-up did collect rewards for crafting the best round Sunday, improving from an 82 the first day to card a 76 that closed the final gap to one.

In addition to the team competition, on-course events were staged in the form of closest-to-the-pin contests on all four host course par three holes each day.

Saturday, shots of the day at the respective holes included Bodo Culberson at the fifth, Rock Pickard at the ninth, Larry Yount at the 12th, and Thomas Thompson at the 14th. Sunday, honors were secured by Meadows at five, Phil Vernesoni at nine, Larry Brawley at 12, and Yount again at 14.

Devillette honored

Jessica Swearingin's high school softball career just won't end. And she's delighted because of it.

Swearingin, one of a number of seniors players key roles in the arrival of the Lady Devils' still-learning fastpitch softball program that celebrated just its fourth year of existence this past spring, is the only Mooresville and Iredell County player named to receive first-team, All-Piedmont honors.

The release of the All-Piedmont team was made official late last week.

Swearingin manned the third-base infield duties and held down the third-place spot in the batting order for the majority of the season for the Devillettes. She proved instrumental in helping lead the team towards a push for a state playoff berth, one that drew to a close only after a loss in the regular-season finale.

She is one of four infielders named to the first team. The honor comes after she was earlier named to the all-conference team also as an infielder.

The only player from Mooresville and all Iredell County teams to make the first team, Swearingin stands out on a list that also features a second team with some limited local connections.

South Iredell junior Sheena Bailey was named one of the All-Piedmont second team's three pitchers, while Mooresville junior Crystal Furmanluk was selected as an infielder on that same team.

Also, in recognitions used to help complete the most recent spring season, South Iredell finished the season with a share of the 14th rank in the final Sweet 16 poll of the year. The Vikes finished the season in first within the Western Foothills Conference and reached the second round of the state playoffs.

In addition to South Iredell, other WFC members Fred T. Foard, ranked tied for seventh, and East Lincoln, 12th, also made the final Sweet 16 poll.
