## Blue Devils Are Ready For Season Finale With Children's Home Friday

Mooresville's Blue Devils will come to the end of the trail in their season tomorrow night when the locals take the field against the Children's Home. Game time is set for 8 p. m. on the Senior High athletic field.

Mooresville, which sports a 7-2 mark going into the contest, will be an undoubted favorite. However, Coach Roy Boyles has given the scouting report to the Methodists and he warns that the Methodists have a much better ball club than their 4-4 record reveals.

Children's Home, running from the single-wing, has practically the entire team returning which almost pulled a surprise against the locals last year before falling 14-0. The Methodists will be out to rebound against Mooresville following a 21-0 setback at the hands of North Rowan last Friday night. They are sure to be at top prime for the encounter against the highly rated defensive Devil line.

The Methodists, after getting off to a fast start the first of the year, have found the going tough in their last four games. They will be out to regain some of the prestige Friday night.

As for the Blue Devils, they aren't selling the abilities of the Methodists short. They have been going through practice sessions the early part of the week, gearing their offensive plays and sharpening up their defenses.

Coch Pearson, although well pleased with the performance of his line in the decision over Kannapolis, still has the forward wall working out at a fast pace.

Pearson works mainly with the line while head Coach Boyles and assistant Jack Loftin spend the major part of their time with the backfield and end chores. This combination, rated one of the best in the North Piedmont, has given Mooresville its share of victories during the past nine games and they hope to add one more to the win side of the column before calling the season a closer.

New plays entered last week are expected to be used against the Methodists. For the many fans who turn out for the game, the coaches have some surprises for the opposition which they hope will also be enjoyable for the fans.

Those expected to start the contest in the backfield for the locals are Tommy Deal at quarterback, Mike Chester at the fullback position and a couple of real speedsters, Mike Robinson and David Oliphant, at the halfback slots.

Pearson's forward block is expected to consist of Roy Brannon, Bill Watson, Dewitt Hinson, Gary Karriker, Bobby Pope, Roy Thompson and Larry Dyson. Plenty of help for these boys will come from Peasey Johnson, Stanley McNeill, David Curtis, Mike Johnson, and Chick Pless on defense.

It is possible that Jim Bailey, Mike Plyter, and Jerry Coats also will see considerable action in the Mooresville backfield.

Possibly the largest crowd of Mooresville fans of the year will be on hand for the season closer.


