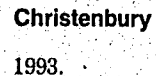


Obituaries

PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY

If you worked as a production worker at Fleetwood's housing, travel trailer, or motor home manufacturing plants in a job with the title of: "line associate," "assembler," "group leader," "team leader" or "supervisor" between February 11, 1997 and February 20, 2001, you may be able to join a class action lawsuit.

The lawsuit claims that employees performed production work before the regular starting time, during lunch break, and after the regular shift, for which they were not paid at either regular or overtime rates. Fleetwood denies the allegations.

Employees may join this suit by mailing a "Consent to Join" form to Plaintiff's lawyers at the address below. The forms must be received no later than September 7, 2001. You may still file a claim even if you do not know how many "off-the-clock" hours you worked.

You will not be charged directly for the lawyers' services. Instead, if they obtain a recovery, the lawyers will receive a part of any settlement or judgment. If there is no recovery, there will be no attorney fee.

If you choose to join the lawsuit, you will be bound by the judgment whether favorable or unfavorable.

The Court has conditionally certified the case as a class action, but has not yet made a decision on its merits.
