## 'This is your life' service honors former pastor

Sunday, July 22, at Fieldstone Presbyterian Church of Mooresville was the annual celebration of Laymen's Sunday with the men of the church being responsible for each part of the worship service. At this special service a layman is honored and this year's recipient was the Rev. Frank Wilkinson.

Layman Bill Douglas called for Rev. Wilkinson to come to the altar and then he stated: "Frank 'This is Your Life'."

This particular date was the 50th anniversary of Rev. Wilkinson's ordination. He is retired and serves various churches as supply minister.

Local and out-of-town persons were in attendance and many took part in the program, beginning with Don Howie of Prospect Presbyterian Church.

He gave background information on Rev. Wilkinson stating that Frank became a church member of Prospect at the age of 17. Today, his picture is included in the Prospect's Historical Room, along with pictures of others who entered the Lord's work from Prospect.

A 1947 graduate of Davidson College, Wilkinson attended Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Ga. and graduated with the Class of 1951. During seminary, he accepted a

student pastor position with Fayetteville Presbytery which involved working at three churches in Johnson County.

During the service, a letter was read from Mrs. Pauline Jones, who was a teenager at that time. She remembered his summer work at Providence Presbyterian Church in Angier.

"He was especially good with all age groups and the youth program became very active under his leadership but he also had

the talent of being able to fill in wherever needed, not only in church, but in the community," her letter stated.

And to Rev. Wilkinson's surprise, Mrs. Jones, along with others from Providence Church, were present for the celebration.

Upon completing seminary, Rev. Wilkinson was called to the Biscoe Presbyterian Church and ordained by the Mecklenburg Presbytery on July 22, 1951. Among those at his ordina-

tion and this celebration were his wife, Celeste Brotherton Wilkinson, and Mrs. Mary Lewis of Mooresville.

Several letters from former members of churches he pastored were read with each thanking him for his leadership and the part he played in their life. Also a letter from the Clerk of Session at Star Presbyterian Church which was organized while he was at Biscoe.

A number of years passed and he accepted the pastorate of Flat Branch Presbyterian Church at Lillington. A member of the church, Elder Ishmael McDonald, was here for the special occasion. He spoke of Rev. Wilkinson's influence in his life. He is now a licensed Lay Preacher serving several churches in Fayetteville Presbytery.

Moving on in 1964 to Manly Church at Southern Pines, Frank was a neighbor to teenager Thomas Richardson, now a professor at the University of Mississippi. His letter of congratulations thanked Frank for teaching him to play the piano and he continues to enjoy the hymns that he learned.

In 1969, Rev. Wilkinson accepted a call to Calvary Presbyterian Church at Davidson and at Sherrills Ford Presbyterian Church in Mecklenburg Presbytery. During that time, Presbytery boundaries were realigned and Rev. Wilkinson remained at Calvary Church until 1977.

The Wilkinson's moved from Davidson to White Hill Presbyterian Church near Sanford which was like moving "home" for Frank and Celeste since most of his ministry had been in that area.

In closing, Fieldstone Elder Bobby Overcash elaborated on Wilkinson's ministry by reading excerpts from numerous letters received offering congratulations and thanks to Frank for his ministry, leadership, and help in many situations that only Frank with his faith and love of people could administer.

On behalf of the church, an engraved plaque was presented to Rev. Wilkinson and he also received other gifts.

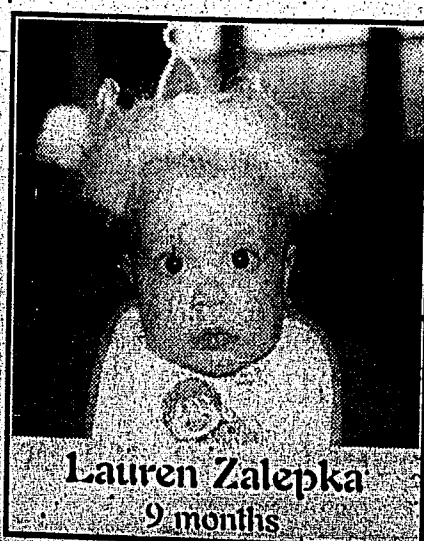

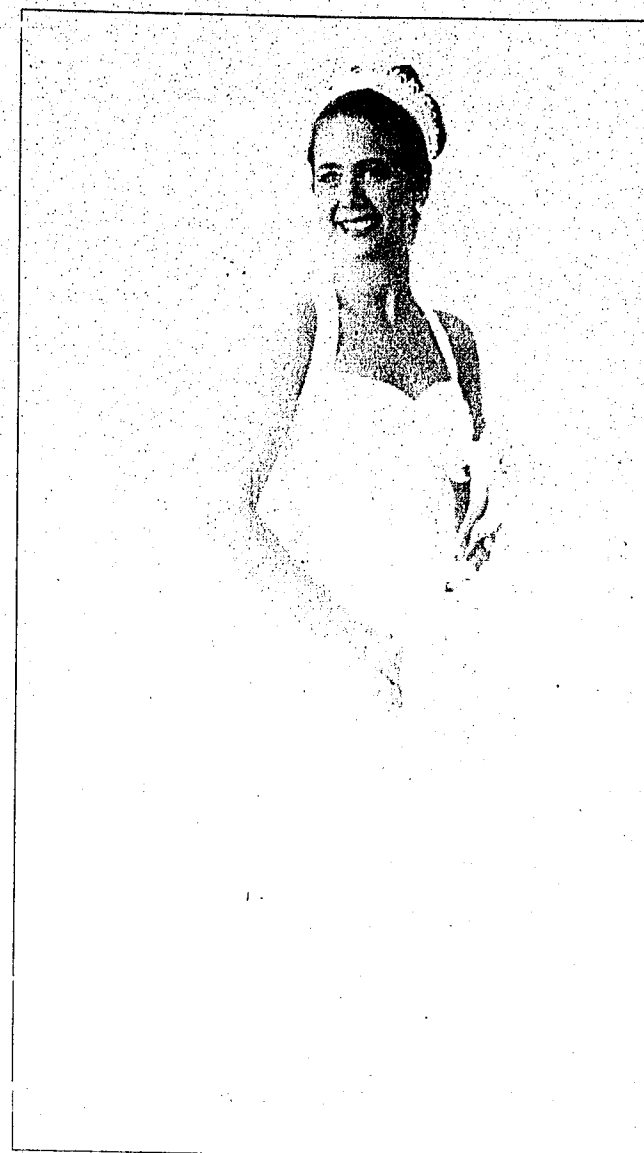
All of the attendants were dressed identically in mid-length blue Thai silk gowns
