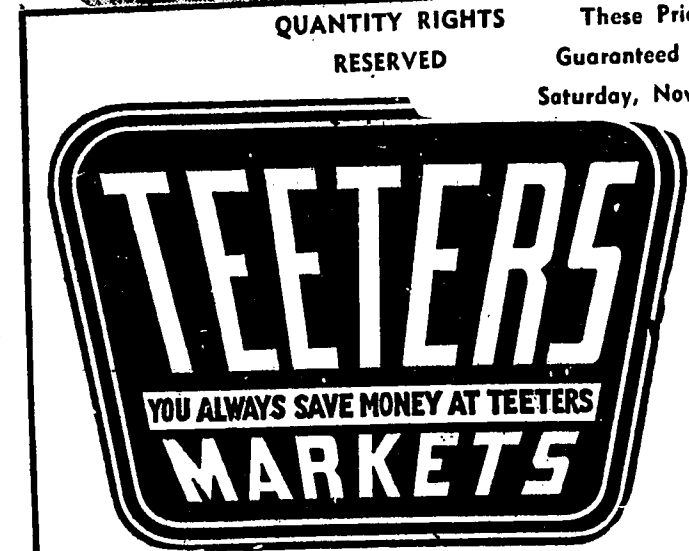

Brown, Jr., and Charles Brown, both of the home, and Gary Lee Brown, a student at Appalachian State Teachers College, Boone; a brother, Ernie T. Brown of Philadelphia, Pa., and two sisters, Mrs. Jess Brown Coble and Mrs. Ruth Brown Shaeffer, both of Philadelphia, Pa.

Funeral services for Mr. Brown were conducted at 11 a. m. Tuesday at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Troutman, with Rev. Olin C. Swiggett officiating. Interment followed in St. Michael's Cemetery.
