governor's taped message, they said that the state can balance its budget without raising taxes.

"At a time when thousands are losing jobs across our state, and at a time when so many families are struggling just to make ends meet, the last thing anyone needs is to pay more taxes," said House Minority Leader Leo Daughtry, R-Johnston.

"There is plenty of money if we spend it wisely. But we can't afford \$22,000 for a chandelier, or \$21,000 to replace a two-year-old portrait of former Gov. Hunt, or a quarter of a million dollars to dredge what might have been Blackbeard's ship. The list goes on and on. Taxpayers will not stand for continued wasteful spending."

And while Easley appealed for legislators to give his cabinet secretaries more flexibility to manage their budgets, Daughtry suggested that the state could generate \$450 million in savings by asking each state agency to reduce spending by 3 percent.

"We're concerned about the 460 people at Corning Cable Systems in Hickory who were laid off yesterday," said Senate Minority Leader Patrick Ballantine, R-New Hanover. "The last thing those people need is a sales tax increase."

"There's been a lot of talk about losing the state's triple-A bond rating. The bond brokers in New York City have never called for North Carolina to increase taxes. All they ask is that we live within our means," Ballantine said.

"Your government should not make parents pay more in sales taxes for school clothes, lunchboxes, backpacks, notebooks or other back-to-school items. Democrats want to slap more taxes on everything in your shopping cart."

For many Democrats, the question is not whether to increase taxes but who
