

## Full Program Is Listed For Christmas Concert

Tonight (Thursday), December 12, the annual Christmas Concert will be presented at 8 o'clock in the Roland R. Morgan Auditorium.

This traditional program will feature the Junior High band, Senior High chorus and the Senior High band.

These organizations will be under the direction of Robert O. Klepper and the chorus will be accompanied by Roy H. Watkins.

The Mooresville Rotary Club, as sponsor of this program, has sold tickets, decorated the auditorium, and members will serve as ushers and provide a social hour after the concert for all those participating in the various musical organizations.

A Christmas present of sorts will be enjoyed by the young musicians in tonight's concert as they have a brand new set of risers. This has been a need of the school bands and choruses and they have managed very well on homemade risers. Through the kindness and hard work of the Mooresville Board of Education and the Mooresville Band and Chorus, this wish is now fulfilled and the new risers will be on display and very much used in tonight's presentation.

The Junior High band will get things started with "Youth Band Festival March" by Howard E. Akers. "Spirit of Christmas" is a new composition by Fred L. Frank in which he has successfully used the carols "Jolly Old St. Nicholas," "Good King Wenceslas," "Covers try Carol," "Away in a Manger," "Pat-A-Pan," and "Joy To The World." This will be followed by "Trooping The Colors" march by R. Watson will open the Senior High band part of tonight's event. This will be followed by a selection of the best songs of Jerome Kern including such hits as "Who," "They Didn't Believe Me," "I've Told Every Little Star," "Yesterday," "Look For The Silver Lining" and others.

The band has selected one number from the current contest list for this concert and it is "Allerseele" by Richard Strauss and another number in a more unusual style of harmonies called "Hong Kong" by Kenneth Henderson.

Mrs. Theresa Peiffer has narrated several times as narrator with the band and this has proven so enjoyable that she will be presenting tonight. She will tell that famous Christmas story of Clement C. Moore, "Twas The Night Before Christmas." The band arrangement has been made by Newell Long for symphonic band and narrator.

Next the band will play a descriptive number by Harold Walser called "The Christmas Play" in which snatches of several carols will be heard and this will bring the band to its concluding number "Yuletide Festival" by John Warrington. In this number you may hear the popular "Rudolph, The Red-nosed Reindeer" and the traditional "Jingle Bells" played together.

The chorus will join the band for several carols and the grand finale will add the Junior High band and the audience in that favorite carol of all times "O Come All Ye Faithful."

## Funeral Rites Conducted For Mrs. McNeely

Mrs. Claudia Fleming McNeely, 82-year-old resident of 740 East Sprague street in Winston-Salem, died in the City Memorial Hospital in Winston-Salem at 7 a. m. Tuesday.

Although she had been in declining health for several years, death was unexpected, being attributed to a stroke of paralysis suffered Monday night.

Mrs. McNeely, widow of William Bruce McNeely, was a former resident of Mooresville and Concord, but had lived in Winston-Salem since the death of Mr. McNeely in 1954.

Born in Burke county on July 28, 1881, Mrs. McNeely was a daughter of the late John Thomas and Rachel McGimpsey Fleming.

The survivors include two sisters, Mrs. L. C. Ketchie of Winston-Salem and Mrs. Florence F. Cleaver of Charlotte. A number of nieces and nephews also survive.

Funeral services were conducted in Mooresville at the Calvin Funeral Chapel at 2:30 p. m. Wednesday, with the Rev. R. Paul Kercher, pastor of the Second Presbyterian Church, in charge. Burial was in the family plot in Willow Valley cemetery.
