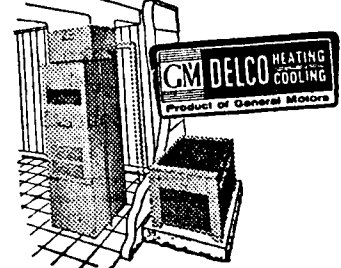

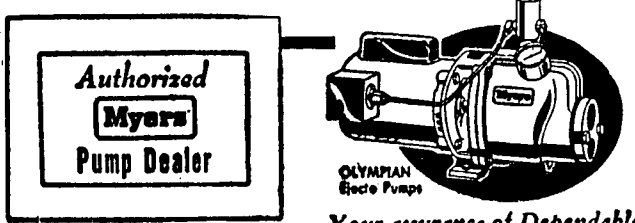

BOMBER BOBBY BRACKETT
Has Troutman's Golden Arm

Even In Losing, Troutman
Can See Bright New Future

Following the 54-12 loss to Mooresville last Friday night, one would have thought Troutman Coach Bill Mayhew would really be down on the officials, Mooresville, his players and practically everything in general.

Such was not the case.

Coach Mayhew had nothing but praise for his team. He remarked on the hustle and spirit of his entire team and remarked, "We're just two years away."

It could be that Mayhew is right. His team, even though getting slaughtered, scrapped right down to the final whistle. The physical strength of the club was evident and the offensive abilities made the Troutman fans as well as many Blue Devil followers look on with admiration. Two times quarterback Bobby Brackett, just a sophomore, completed pass after pass to carry the Bobcats to the scoring stripe.

In fact, Brackett erased all conference records in the passing department by completing 29 of 50 attempts.

Mayhew, in his first year at Troutman, switched the team from the single-wing offense to the wide open pro type of attack and offensively it has proven very successful. The main drawback this year is the defense, which allows too many points for the opposition.

With this brand of offense and the capable hands of Brackett, plus some fine receivers in Gayle Murdock, Steve Bynum, Tommy Bush and Ronnie Jayner, Brackett will be the top offensive quarterback in the league.

Not just in the Mooresville game, but in practically every game the Bobcats have played this season, Brackett has been the boy on the field to watch. His passing has amazed the opposing coaches and setting up a defense for his tosses in time to come will be a real challenge.

Two more years remain for Brackett, sure to become one of the top signal callers in the state, and as Brackett improves the entire team will improve. Along with this will come better days in the future for Troutman football.

Mooresville's Junior High Red Imps, still seeking their first win of the season, travel to Landis for their final game Saturday night. Game time is set for 7:30 p. m.

Having a week off due to a canceled game against Bandys last week, the local youngsters have two weeks of practice behind them as they wind up preparations for the season closer.

Coach Dave Richardson and assistants Bill Griffith and Conrad Thorne have really been sending the team through hard head-knocking line sessions as they plan to go all out for a win against the highly-rated Landis eleven.

Richardson reports the team has shown considerable improvement steadily during the season and also that the entire unit will be at full strength for the final contest.

Defense and offense has been the order of business at practices on Hood Field for the past 10 days as the coaches attempted to install a winning combination of 11 boys to man the starting positions.

It is expected Richardson will have a first team unit of Tony Levan and Johnny Verbe at ends, John Beam and Bill Keeter at tackles, Frank Rader and Joe Benson at guards and Clarence Black at the center slot.

Directing the Imps offensively will be Mike Deaton at quarterback with Larry Sprinkle and Mitchell Coggins at the halfbacks. Tommy Brown gets the nod as the starter at fullback.

Mooresville, by virtue of its 54-12 decision over Troutman last Friday night, has a lock on second place in the North Piedmont conference standings.

The Blue Devils of Coach Roy Boyles sports a 5-1 conference mark and are 6-2 for the year.

Unbeaten Monroe continues to hold the top spot with six straight conference victories. It is the only unbeaten, untied team in the Western North Carolina High School Activities Association with eight straight victories.

The only conference loss for the Blue Devils came from the North Piedmont champions four weeks ago by a heartbreaking 13-11 score. Their non-conference defeat was administered by Kings Mountain 14-0.

Third place in the league standings is held by East Rowan with a 3-3 record, while North Rowan with a 2-3 league mark is in the fourth spot. Overall marks of the NP teams are East Rowan 35-1, North Rowan 24-1, Children's Home 44, Davie County 24, West Rowan 26-1 and Troutman 16-1.

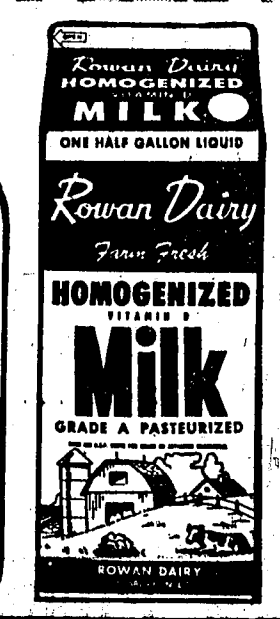
