**Funeral Rites Conducted For R. Lee McLean**

Robert Lee McLean, 78-year-old resident of Troutman, route 2, died in the Iredell Memorial Hospital in Statesville at 2 a. m. Friday, following a long period of declining health.

A former resident of Mooreville, he was prior to his retirement, a lineman with the Mooreville Telephone Company.

A native of Iredell county, Mr. McLean was born on July 26, 1885, a son of the late William Alec and Sue Godger McLean. He was twice married. Following the death of his first wife, Mrs. Beulah Johnson McLean, he was married to the former Miss Vertie Huffman.

The second wife died a number of years ago.

The survivors include: one son, Robert L. McLean of Charleston, S. C.; one daughter, Mrs. Robert Ostwald of Mooreville; two stepdaughters, Mrs. Henry Whitener of Statesville and Mrs. T. W. Stiller of Youngstown, Ohio; one brother, Webb A. McLean of Mooreville; and two sisters, Mrs. Harlan N. Craven of Mooreville and Mrs. E. O. Claininger of Troutman. Ten grandchildren also survive.

Funeral services were conducted at 2 p. m. Saturday at the Calvin Funeral Chapel, with the Rev. Ray Cody, pastor of the Triplet Methodist Church at Mazonia in charge. Burial was in the family plot in the Willow Valley cemetery.

**Funeral Rites Conducted For W. L. Stell**

Wallace Linden (Bill) Stell, 54-year-old resident of 115 Culp street, passed away at 6 p. m. Saturday in the Iredell Memorial Hospital in Statesville. Death was attributed to a heart attack, suffered an hour earlier while at radio station WDBM in Statesville where he was an announcer.

Mr. Stell was born February 25, 1909 in Petersburg, Va., son of the late William Algernon and Emma Jackson Stell. He had been a radio announcer and disc jockey since 1922, having served in the Richmond, Va., area for 25 years.

He was a purple heart veteran of World War II.

Mr. Stell was twice married—first to the former Sarah Virginia Darity, who died in 1956. On August 4, 1958, he was married to the former Louise Ezell, who survives.

Also surviving are: two sons, William Linden and John Wilkin Stell, both of the home; and one brother, Arthur Stell of Ettrick, Va.

Funeral services were held at 4 p. m. Tuesday at the Crews Funeral Home in South Hill, Va., conducted by the Rev. Samuel S. Cole. Interment was in La Crosse cemetery in Virginia.
