Oscar Brown Suffers Fatal Heart Attack

Oscar Lee Brown, 69, general construction superintendent for Barger Construction Company, died unexpectedly at his home on the Mount Ulla Highway at 3:45 a. m. Friday.

Death was attributed to a heart attack.

A native and lifelong resident of Iredell county, Mr. Brown was born on September 17, 1893, a son of the late James W. and Minnie Troutman Brown.

He had been associated with Barger Construction Company since 1929 and was well known and highly esteemed by a wide circle of friends.

Services are held each evening at 7 o'clock, and there is special music each evening.

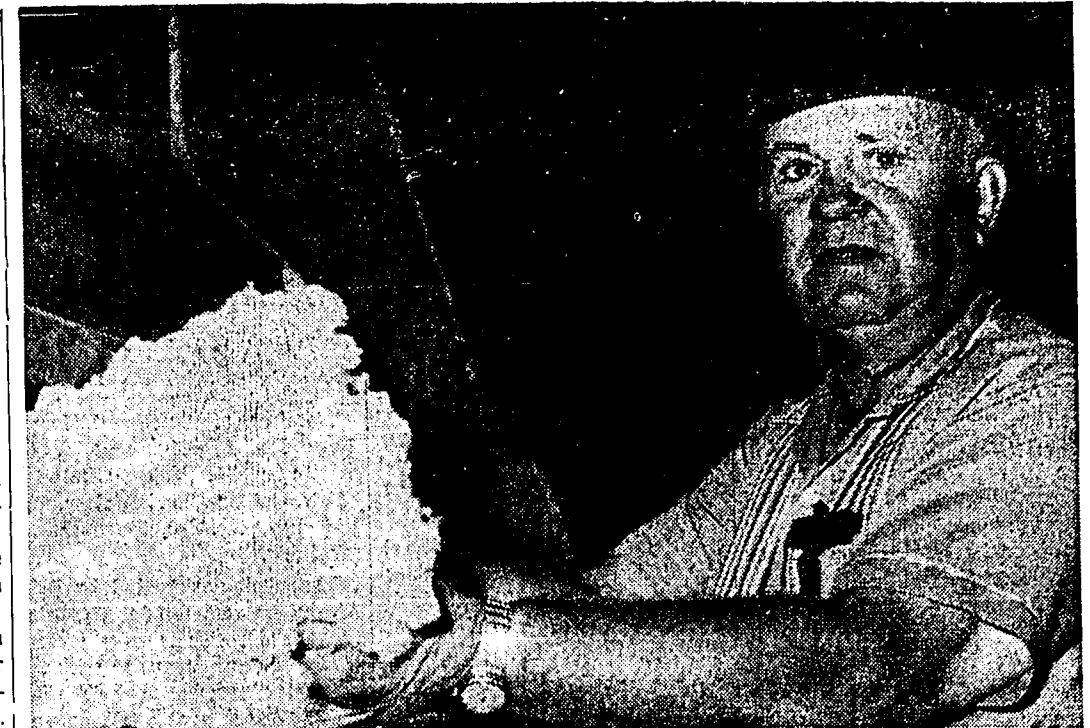
The pastor, the Rev. Vann Ray Long, invites the public to attend the services.
