

Mrs. Robinson Laid To Rest Monday At 3

Mrs. Bertha Harwell Robinson, age 88, passed away at 7:45 o'clock last Saturday night, September 21, at her home on Mooresville, route 2. She had been in failing health for the past four years and seriously ill since May.

Born on December 20, 1874 in Catawba county, Mrs. Robinson was the daughter of the late Wail, and Julia Ann Hager Harwell. She was the widow of the late Z. Clifton Robinson who preceded her in death in 1937.

In her early childhood, she joined the Rehebe Methodist Church at Terrell and later became a faithful member of the McKendree Chapel Methodist Church.

She had lived in the Mooresville, route 2, community for many years and was well known and highly esteemed by a wide circle of friends.

Twelve grandchildren also survive, along with one sister, Mrs. Walter Linberger of Statesville, and two brothers, Mall Harwell of Greensboro and Everette Harwell of Mooresville.

Funeral services were held at the Rehebe Methodist Church at Terrell on Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock, conducted by her pastor, the Rev. L. E. Paschal, pastor of the McKendree Methodist Church, assisted by the Rev. Don Bridger, pastor of the Mount Zion Methodist Church at Cornelius. Burial was in the family plot in the Rehebe Methodist Church cemetery.

Wednesday evening, Dr. Shriver discussed the topic: "The Stewardship Of Religion And Life."


Thursday evening's topic will be: "The Stewardship Of Talent" and Friday night the subject of the sermon will be: "The Stewardship Of Personal Decision."
