BEGIN SIX-GAME SCHEDULE

Coach Richardson And Red Imps Set For D. Matt Saturday Night

Thirty-two players, three coaches and four managers, having survived rugged training for the past three weeks were labeled ready and capable by Junior High Head Coach Dave Richardson today. The local Red Imps now are in final stages of practice prior to their opening game at Statesville Saturday night.

D. Matt Thompson will be the opponent for the locals and game time is set for 7:30 p. m. on the Statesville Senior High Athletic Field.

Richardson is very enthusiastic about the chances of this year's team. He reports each boy has been giving a good effort and he hopes to field a team which will be a good representative in the newly-formed Central Piedmont Junior High Conference.

All the Junior High games will be played on Saturday night, both home and away, and the starting time for all will be the same as in the opener. Teams making up the conference other than Mooresville are Landis, China Grove, Troutman, Oakwood, D. Matt Thompson and Bandys.

The locals will be away from home their first two games and will make their debut before the homefolk October 12 against Oakwood of Statesville. Many local grid fans are expected to be on hand for the opener against D. Matt this Saturday night.

Richardson will have a highly talented line manned by veterans at each position. The middle of the forward wall contains the majority of the strength with experienced players Joe Benson, Frank Rader, Bill Keeter and John Beam as the anchor men.

Passing and the split-end series also are in store for the opposition as the Imps operate on the same basic series as the Senior High team. Mike Deaton at quarterback is expected to do the major portion of the passing.

Halfbacks Larry Sprinkle and Mitchell Coggins form what is expected to be a fine combination of

speedy runners. As for the full-back post, two boys, Tommy Brown and David Bowles, are showing up good. Richardson is still doubtful as to which will start the game.

Center Clarence Black is expected to get the nod here while Tony Levan has the left end job. Johnny Verbe and Jim Benfield are battling hot and heavy for the nod at right end and only at game time will the decision be known.

Forming the second offensive unit will be Verbe or Benfield and Jim Moore at ends, Milton Crowell and Steve Brannon at tackles, Randy Oliphant and Joe Lowrance at guards, Junior Ervin at the center spot.

Taste-Freez will be chosen by team members and the coaching staff to determine the winner in the past week's game. The player chosen will be awarded a \$5 gift certificate by Taste-Freez.

At the end of the season the local business concern will recognize a boy chosen by the team as "Player Of The Year." This winner will be awarded a \$25 savings bond.

As an added incentive to help boost the Junior High football program, Taste-Freez will have on display in its window a large team picture and a large individual picture of the past week's winner will join the display.

The sponsoring concern is located at 870 N. Main street.

The Iron Works squad appears to have the other teams on the run in the local Midget League gridiron campaign. The Ironmen in three games have come out winners on two occasions and are credited with one tie. This record puts them at 4-1-1 and the second contest is slated to begin around 5:15 p. m.

For action and thrills that only these youngsters of the gridiron can give, make plans now to be on hand for the games Saturday afternoon.

Commissioners and officials handling the close of the playing and running of the Midget League football program met at the War Memorial last week and laid ground-work to make the league more attractive for the fans and more interesting for the players.

League President Clayton Dyson, presiding over the discussion, outlined problems this far and worked out details for the year.

It was decided to present a trophy to the team that ended up the season at the top of the four-team circuit. Also to make it more interesting for the players it was decided to present two trophies to each team, one to the most outstanding lineman and one to the most outstanding backfield boy.

Taking into consideration the fine support thus far this year, it was decided to have an all-star game on Saturday, October 19, beginning at 8 p. m.

The All-Star teams will be made up of players from the top place team and the fourth place team taking on outstanding players from the second and third place teams.

It was decided to have a banquet at the end of the season at which time these trophies will be awarded. The exact date of the banquet was not set, but it will be held on either the 21st, 22nd or 24th of October with the place and time yet to set.

An schedule change was set by the officials. The game of Oct. 12, previously a night game, was changed to an afternoon contest beginning at 2 o'clock in order to avoid conflict with the Junior High team which will be playing in Mooresville that night against Troutman.

Mitchell Coggins will be at quarterback, Larry Cooke and Tony Knott at halfbacks and John Goodman at the fullback slot.

Other boys listed on the team roster are Rick Perry, Lee Sautter, Larry Thompson, Donald Readling, Steve Kistler, Randy Beam, Monte Harrington, Mike Frye, Randy McConnell, Charles Pope and Gene Millsaps.

Tommy Oliphant who was slated for first team duty received an ankle injury during the practice period and his playing status for the first few games is very much in doubt.
